New features and programs:

- **ProQuest 1,000** – One universal effect of the COVID-19 pandemic for academic libraries and their patrons has been a sharp increase in usage for electronic resources. ProQuest has certainly seen a dramatic surge on our own Ebook Central platform. Librarians have confirmed that increased usage and activity is being driven by the need for faculty and students to move away from print and engage with ebooks on a wider scale. This collection will cover materials from the Bibliothèque nationale de France with a thematic focus on travel literature of approximately 500,000 pages and more than 2,000 works. Also included are government travel reports, letters, religious journals, ethnographic monographs and writings inspired by travel within and beyond European borders. The collection includes the travels of Jean De Mandeville (1300-1372), the earliest surviving texts in French as he travels to places such as Jerusalem. These works heavily influenced later travelers, including Christopher Columbus. It also includes Jean Donneau de Visé (1638-1710), a French journalist, royal historian, playwright and publicist covering descriptions of the travels of the ambassadors of Siam to France. Also, a wealth of maps and images by French geographer Pierre Duval (1619-1683) are captured and fully discoverable.

Early English Books Online



In the early modern period, commercial operators in the bookselling business were dominated by men, but some female printers became well known as specialists in making religious works more accessible to the wider population. Printers include Joanna Brome, Alice Broade, Mary Avery and the widow of Stephen Swart. Perhaps the most prolific printer was Elizabeth Mallet of Black-Horse-Alley, near Fleet-Bridge, who was also the first English printer and bookseller who produced Britain’s first daily newspaper, *The Daily Courant*. Elizabeth Mallet was also an author of a number of works that document gallows speeches and confessions of pirates, whilst Anne Purslowe interviewed criminals in Newgate Prison. Various female religious writers such as Sarah Cheevers and Katherine Evans covered persecution and inquisition in Malta, while Margaret Mortimer lobbied the government to improve the charity laws on legislation around the poor. From this small selection of works in this EEBO release, we see female businesswomen active on many fronts of early modern Britain.

The 2020 annual update is comprised of 594 titles, over 22,000 pages, gathered from over 30 libraries. Topics covered range from religion to history chronicles to travel literature to jurisprudence. Of particular interest is the almost 20 works written or printed by women.

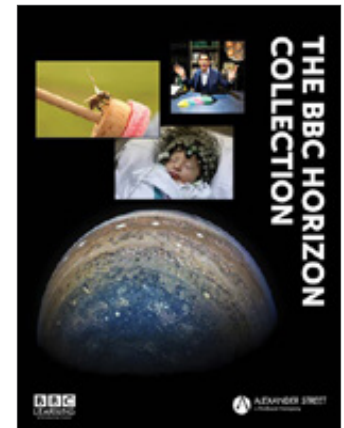
