8th California Infantry Regiment (Oct 1864): The 8th California Infantry Regiment was raised in the last year of the Civil War. It served in posts in the San Francisco Bay and on the Columbia River.

1868 Hayward Earthquake (Oct 1868): The 1868 Hayward earthquake occurred in the San Francisco Bay Area, California on October 21, 1868, an estimated moment magnitude of 6.4–6.7, and a maximum Mercalli intensity of VI (violent), it was the most recent large earthquake to occur on the Hayward Fault Zone.

California Inmigrant Union (Oct 1869): The California Inmigrant Union is an organization founded in 1869 to promote the settlement of California by people from the Eastern United States and Europe.

The Astronomical Society of the Pacific (ASAP) (Dec 1889): The Astronomical Society of the Pacific (ASAP) is an American scientific and educational organization, founded in San Francisco on February 7, 1889. It is the largest general astronomy education society in the world, with members from over 42 countries.

The Battle of Stone Corral (Jan 1892): After months of searching for fugitive robbers, John Sontag and Christopher Evans, also known as the Sontag-Evans Gang, authorities caught up with them in June 1892 in what is now known as the Battle of Stone Corral, or the Gunfight at Stone Corral, near Visalia, California.

Table Fog (Jan 2002): There is heavy air pollution in Visalia in the form of smog and other air pollutants. The San Joaquin Valley is susceptible to atmospheric inversions, which trap pollutants from vehicles, trains, manufacturing, and other sources.
